



### Open Records Act: 51 O.S. § 24A.1-29.

- Any private citizen can file an Open Records Request without stating a reason.
- All records are open unless specifically exempt.
- <u>Emails/Documents on Agency computers</u> are Open Records, so guard your words!!!
   <u>Radio Traffic---guard your words!!!</u>
- Any dash/body cam video is for the most part an open record. As indicated above, anyone can request the video and they do not need to indicate the reason for the request.

### Video used to catch citian cultivating marijuana plants

PAWNEE - A Stillwater man has been charged with cultivating marijuana on land owned by Oklahoma Gas and Electric near Sooner Lake in Pawnee County, in a case investigated by the state narcotics bureau.

The field had 31 cultivated marijuana plants and an electric irrigation system when it was eradicated on Aug. 8, according to an affidavit filed in Pawnee County District Court.

\$10,000 bond pending his return to court Sept. 15 when he can ask for a preliminary hearing from Pawnee County Associate District Judge Matthew Henry.

V Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control agent Stephen Gibson wrote in an affidavit that Kay County District Attorney's officer Kyle Hartwig contacted him on June 1 regarding a cultivated marijuana field in Pawnee County.

Hartwig said that OG&E security personnel had observed a man around the area of the field and were able to identify the suspect as Shipman, according to Gibson's affidavit.

On June 3 when Gibson and a small team of agents observed the marijuana field, it had about 60 cultivated marijuana plants, an electric pump powered by a 12-volt car battery and other cultiva- Attorney Rene Henry Jr.

tion equipment contained inside a barbed wire fence built to keep livestock out of the marijuana field, the affidavit said.

Gibson said that he installed a covert surveillance camera in the marijuana field, his affidavit said.

On June 14, he replaced the videotape in the camera system and viewed the removed tape, which showed a white male watering and grooming the marijuana plants on June 12, the affidavit said.

On June 14, Noble County Game Warden Dougi Gottschalk was shown a photo taken from the video Steve Glynn Shipman, 52, has been released on and indicated that the man appeared to be Shipman, whom he had contacted on May 28 parked in the walk-in area about 300 yards from the marijuana field, the affidavit said.

The affidavit alleged two more times tapes showed. Shipman working the plants.

Gibson said that Hartwig had personally observed Shipman's residence in Stillwater and had seen a pickup registered to Shipman parked in front of Shipman's residence, the affidavit said.

After eradicating the marijuana field, Gibson served a search warrant at Shipman's residence and arrested him, according to his affidavit.

If convicted of cultivation of marijuana, Ship could receive a sentence from two years to prison and as much as a \$50,000 fine, ace the charge filed by Pawnee County Assis

However a female stepped up and submitted licensure paperwork on behalf of Gold J&S asserting to be 100 percent owners of the L.L.C. This firm was granted a license by the OMMA which will expire in March of 2023.

However lack of Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics registration documents and according to the affidavit this Jennings grow site "did not even meet the (1st) threshold requirements" "to cultivate and manufacture marijuana".

A Creek County district judge signed the search warrant based on the probable cause information presented to her.

Six persons were detained and mirandized at the grow scene with the names of the detained being: Wei Wang of Flushing New York age 47 years; Xiu Pin Ou; Zai Quin Zhu; Xinohe Lin; Boshan Lin and Xiu Ying Zhou.

Authorities noted the elaborate and high tech surveillance system at the property. None at the scene could produce any documentation of a lawful state certified growing regimen.

Authorities recovered and inventories 500 pounds of processed marijuana and 5,807 individual plants alive and

in varied states of growth.

Agent 'Z' of the OBN an oriental languages specialist at the scene acted as a bilingual translator as English was not the first language of the people found working this huge grow endeavor.

In confidence three of the five persons interviewed pointed direct at Mr Wei Wang as the boss man and grow manager.


Under questioning Wang played stupid and his answers provided to authorities do not ring true.

Authorities are pressing the most serious criminal allegations upon Wang as he has been initially charged with; cultivations of dope; conspiracy to violate UCDSA, unlawful use of video facilities to facilitate felony crimes and trafficking in illegal drugs.


Wang was initially booked into the Creek County jailhouse on the afternoon of August 31st.

Wang is due in Creek County District Court for arraignments and other initial procedures on November 16, 2022.

### Plan Ahead=Be Prepared



#### OKLAHOMA BUREAU OF NARCOTICS OPERATIONS ORDER

- 1. Situation: The Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics Ardmore District Office has been conducting an investigation involving the Methamphetamine Trafficking activities of David Wayne Johnson JR and Robert Eugene Tiller in Marshall County, Oklahoma since March of 2019. Beginning in November 2020 and concluding in January 2021, Senior Agent Ethan Chandler (case agent) and other investigators executed a wire interception on David Wayne Johnson JR's cellular phones. During the wire interceptions, several individuals were intercepted and identified as co-conspirators in Johnson's Drug Trafficking Organization. Johnson was intercepted and observed utilizing multiple sources of supply for methamphetamine, one being Robert Eugene Tiller. Johnson made several trips to Oklahoma City and pick up two or more pounds of methamphetamine from one source and utilized Robert Eugene Tiller to resupply in Madill, Oklahoma when he was needing a faster turn-around.
- 2. Mission: The Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics, Ardmore Police Department, Marshall County Sheriff's Office, Madill Police Department, Johnston County Sheriff's Office, Durant Police Department, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, Chickasaw Lighthorse Police Department, U.S Marshalls Service, Choctaw Nation Police Department and the Bureau of Indian Affairs will execute 5 search warrants and several arrest warrants on March 25, 2021 stemming from this investigation. Arrangements have been made to transport all arrestees to Marshall County Jail in Madill, Oklahoma, after being interviewed by Agent Chandler, where charges from this case have been filed.

All defendants have been cross-checked for Native American Citizenship through the "Five Civilized Tribes" and only arrest warrants for non-native American defendants will be served on this day. If defendants claim to be Native American Citizens when law enforcement personnel come into contact with them, their identifications will be checked with the tribe they associate with to ensure all proper procedures are followed.

#### 3. Execution:

a. Concept of Operations: One search warrant in Ardmore (Carter County), two search warrant in Madill (Marshall County) and two search warrants in Johnston County will be served simultaneously in an effort to minimize the risk to law enforcement by not allowing the targets of the operation to communicate with each other or warn each other during the operation. Fifteen (15) arrest warrants will also

for approval, as well as Agent Chandler.
